Companion Cards

Darwin Triple Crown Supercars is affiliated with Companion Cards to ensure all patrons have full and equal access to the event. Companion card holders can book a Companion Card ticket when accompanying a General Admission paying ticket holder. This can be done during the purchase process on Ticketek. Please choose the Companion Card option. This is limited to one companion per ticket holder. You may be asked to show your companion card at the entry. Ticketek Accessible Ticketing Terms and Conditions apply.

Hidden Disabilities Sunflower Initiative

Darwin Triple Crown Supercars is proud to partner with the **Hidden Disabilities Sunflower Initiative**.

Sunflower lanyards and wristbands are free and available to collect from:

- Accessibility Information Booth (located at Gate 3)
- The Hidden Disabilities Sunflower booth (located in Track Centre near the accessible viewing platform)

Sunflower lanyards tell other people that you might need extra help, understanding, or just more time.

Selected staff have completed the Hidden Disabilities Sunflower training, and wear the sunflower supporter lanyards if you need support.

Getting there

Accessible parking

Dedicated parking bays are available at Gate 3 entrance and are clearly indicated on the event map. Please show your Australian Disability Parking Scheme Badge to the traffic controllers on arrival for access to the parking area.

For patrons being dropped off, the closest drop off point is at the Gate 3 entrance.

Getting there

Free public transport

All buses* have low-floors and ramps to accommodate wheelchairs and light mobility aids. Supercars offers free transport to the event from CBD locations. You will need to show your ticket when getting onto the bus. Event champions have direct contact with the bus company to ensure getting onto the bus is an easy process. *subject to vehicle availability closer to the event.

Entering the event

All gates have wide lanes and are accessible. There is a recommended entry lane at Gate 3 that has been modified for wheelchair access. The lane will be signed.

Venue Access

Hidden Valley is made up of rocky ground, gravel, grass, concrete and concrete paths.

There are a few catering and bar areas, each with varying access. The Terraces are the easiest to access, as they are closest to the entry and exit, as well as the accessible viewing area and bathrooms. Merchandise Alley in the pit garage area has concrete paths and can be accessed via the internal shuttle bus / Carpentaria bus / buggies.

There is limited seating available across the site, however, there are dedicated accessible viewing platforms for those who require it.

Accessible Matting

Santos has partnered with Tourism and Events NT to provide accessible matting onsite. Accessible matting will be laid at the dedicated accessible lane at Gate 3, and other key areas across the site such as Track Centre.

Enjoying the event

Accessible bathrooms:

Locations with accessible friendly bathrooms will be available on the accessible map closer to the event.

Accessible platforms:

Carpentaria Disability Services has partnered with Tourism and Events NT to deliver the Carpentaria Accessibility Viewing Platform. It is open to anyone requiring access due to a physical or intellectual mobility. The space is reserved to ensure a controlled environment. Please register via the following accessibility request form, this is valid with a general admission ticket:

Sensory information:

The venue can be loud and crowded. Free sensory bags are available from the Accessibility Information booth and Hidden Disabilities Sunflower booth, with ear buds, earmuffs, communication cards and sensory toys available.

Enjoying the event

Support & assistance:

Event staff have completed the Hidden Disabilities Sunflower training and wear the sunflower supporter lanyards if you need assistance. Please speak to one of our friendly event champions who are wearing high visibility vests and have direct communications with event control who can assist with any questions, concerns or emergencies.

Carpentaria shuttle bus:

An accessible shuttle bus operated by Carpentaria is available by contacting event control on the day. Or speak to one of our friendly event champions on site for assistance.

Buggies:

Buggies will be available to help provide support to event goers across the site who may require further assistance. To book transport with one of the buggies, please visit the information booth at Gate 3. Unfortunately, despite extensive efforts to source accessible buggies, we have been unable to secure suitable vehicles due to limited availability across the Northern Territory. We apologise for any inconvenience this may cause.

Enjoying the event

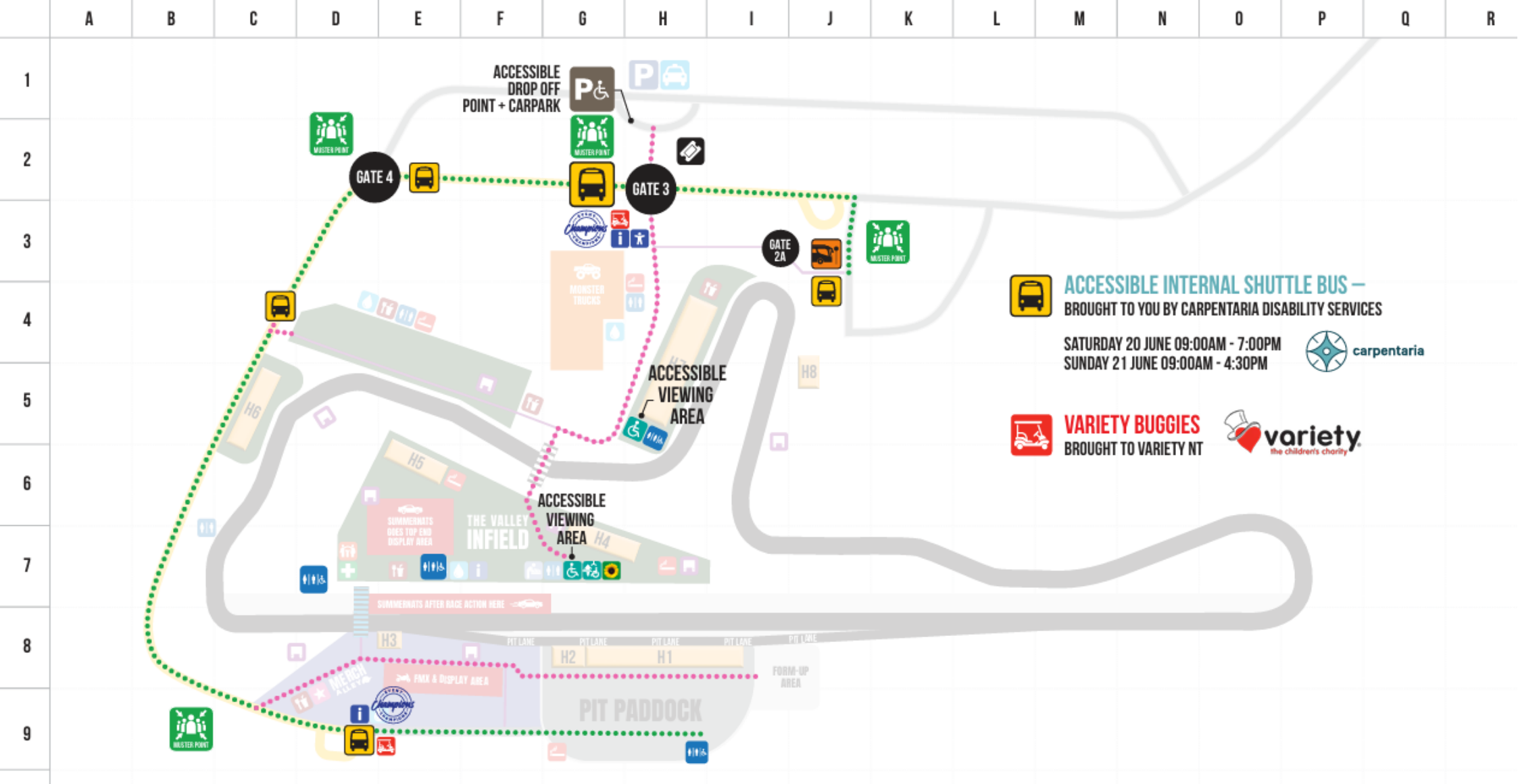
Changing Places:

This year, there will be a portable Changing Places which offers a versatile solution to assist people with high support needs who are not adequately supported by standard accessible toilets. This is achieved through providing a larger than standard accessible toilet with extra features to meet the needs of people with disability and their carers. The keys can be collected from the booth next to the Changing Places Facility.
